### Your Goodwill is...

When Breanna was in fourth grade, her family moved to find a home away from the influence of drugs and violence. Soon after, Breanna's father was in and out of the picture, and her mother started to isolate herself. Breanna had to grow up fast. "I started to take care of my brothers and sisters, making sure that their homework was completed after school, making sure that they were getting showers and baths... that went on for a couple years."

Breanna had to start supporting herself financially at 16. She worked full time while finishing school, but she still couldn't afford rent. An online search led Breanna to apply to Goodwill. She was nervous about the interview, but she got the job and started on her 18th birthday.

Breanna showed up ready to learn and grow, asking questions, working hard, going the extra mile, and covering shifts whenever needed. Two months in, she was promoted to Customer Service Manager. Only five short years later, Breanna is a



District Manager and runs eight Goodwill stores in Frederick and Carroll County, Maryland. She knows her four year old son is proud of her and she's happy with the life she's able to provide for her children.

"When I walked into Goodwill five years ago, I was someone that was very nervous, very scared, I didn't know what I was doing with my life. And five years later, I have built a career path for myself."

### Your Goodwill is...

Sonia was a single teenage mother of two by the time she was 19. "I was hopeless, and I was afraid."

When Sonia walked into a Career Center looking for work, Career Coach Alexandria could see she had a fire and determination in her. "I found out how dedicated she was to upskilling herself. She wanted to take our self-paced digital literacy program to earn her Northstar Certificate. She made sure that all her free time was spent in the center to complete it."

Sonia was a fast learner and completed the program quickly, and she immediately signed up for the financial literacy course. "I've always learned the wrong way on how to save money. I am saving money today, taking care of my debt and my credit."

Sonia has since completed the financial literacy and digital literacy courses, and continues to work on improving herself, finding motivation to be better for her kids. "When I was young, I was always



taught to do everything for yourself, because it was shameful and embarrassing to reach out for help...it meant that you were weak. I just had to have the courage to ask for help, and I didn't think it was going to be that easy, but it was."

"I have big dreams, and big goals, and I'm so happy to say that now because I'm a different person today, and I just want to be a better person for myself, my family and my community."
